- I. On the map provided, label the following places. The name in parenthesis is the name currently used for these places.

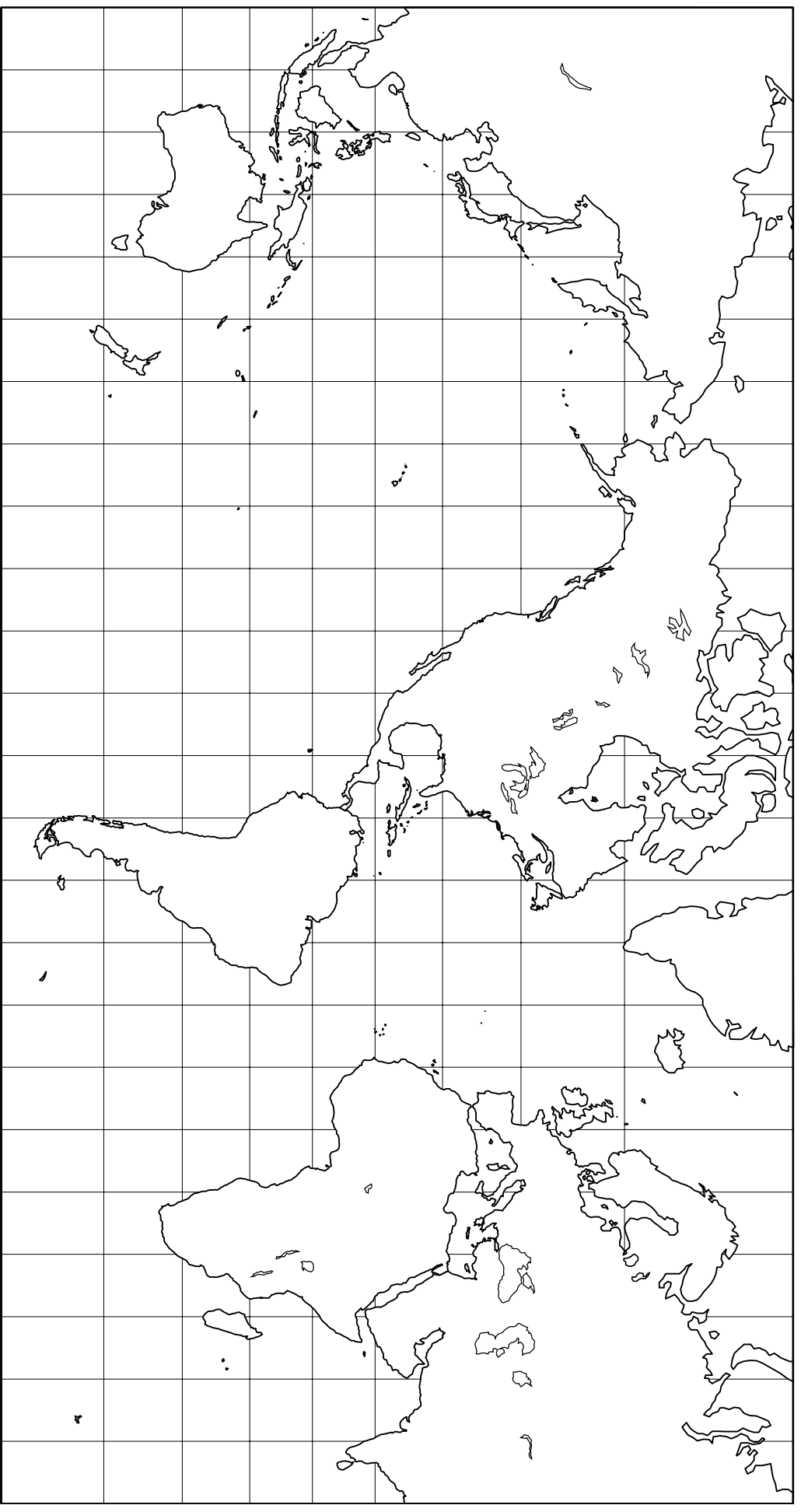
